



HAM DOWN WOODLAND BURIAL GROUND

COST OF BURIAL

Interment Plot £750

This includes:

- The Grant of Right of Burial of a body or ashes in a plot allocated by the Grantor.
- A tree (with guard and stake) chosen from the given list of indigenous trees.
- Allowance for the replacement of any dead tree within the first five years.

The cost of a plot alongside an existing grave is £675.

A second interment of ashes may subsequently be interred along with the ashes of the deceased without further charge for the plot excluding the plot preparation fee.

An approved wooden plaque with the name of the deceased and their lifespan can be ordered (see separate sheet).

All details concerning the positions of the graves and the names of the deceased are carefully noted in the Burial Register, available to view by appointment.

There are marker posts on the site so relatives and friends can locate the plot of their loved one. All this information will be given on the appropriate form to the next-of-kin of the deceased.

The cost of the interment is a separate item and if undertakers are involved will be dealt with by them. Otherwise, we can provide the contact details of a grave-digger and further information on bio-degradable coffins.

Conditions

Biodegradable coffins or urns or other approved material must be used.

The owner of the land undertakes to select the plot, maintain the burial ground, supply and plant the chosen tree and to record the position of the grave.

No plastic flowers, pots or ornaments are allowed, although native wild flowers or bulbs may be planted only on the grave. All dead flowers will be removed from the graves, but if undertaken by relatives they should be placed in the container situated in the top left corner of the burial ground.

There is a small car park alongside the Burial Ground which will hold up to ten cars. Extra parking is available at Bere Marsh Farm. Funerals can take place between the hours of 10am and 4pm on a weekday and 10am to 12 noon on a Saturday.

No exhumation can take place at any time, except under the directions of a court order.

The Woodland Burial Ground at Bere Marsh Farm, Shillingstone, Blandford, Dorset has been open since May 2000.

The main stipulations for burial are as follows:

1. The grave must be in the allotted plot and must be dug to a depth of 4 feet 6 inches.
2. Biodegradable coffins must be used or other approved types.
3. Ashes can also be accepted for burial, if in an urn it must be biodegradable.
4. The owners of the land will undertake to maintain the plot, plant the chosen tree on the grave, replace dead trees within the first five years, provide a deed of "Right of Burial", provide a plan of the Burial Ground and give the relatives permanent access to the site.
5. No plastic flowers will be permitted or any permanent memorial allowed on the graves except for the plaque provided by the owners, but native bulbs or wild flowers may be planted if so wished (only on the grave).
6. There is a small car park alongside the site which holds up to ten cars, including the vehicle carrying the coffin. This should ideally be an estate car or similar vehicle. There is additional car parking at the farm before reaching the site. Please do not park near Bere Marsh Cottage at the end of the road which is unconnected with the farm.
7. The site will always remain a Woodland Burial Ground with future access assured. Long term, it may be necessary to thin some of the trees as the woodland reaches maturity. The situation of the graves will always be recorded in the Burial Register.

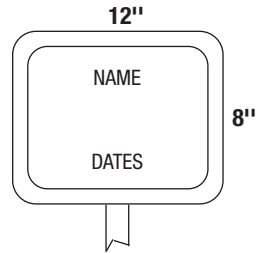
Plaques
